<u>VOICES FROM IPSWICH.</u> Participatory filmmaking project working with Professor Julia O'Connell Davidson and her team on the project, Modern Marronage, the Pursuit and Practise of Freedom in the Contemporary World (MMPPF) to produce films and build filmmaking skills with research participants who've arrived in the UK seeking asylum.

I co-directed together with the research participants the short documentary film, *Voices from Ipswich*, which thematises the young people's experiences and realities of navigating the asylum system in the UK. With the same group, we are currently creating three short films that explore and challenge normative assumptions on Modern Slavery as part of an AHRC Impact Acceleration grant on 'Changing the Modern Slavery Narrative'.
